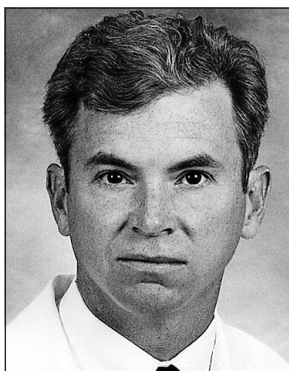


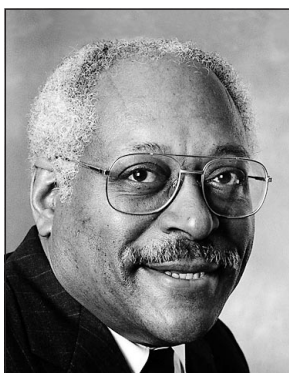
New Editorial Board Members

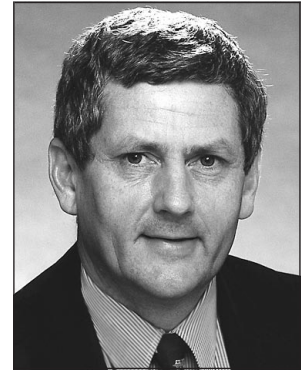
