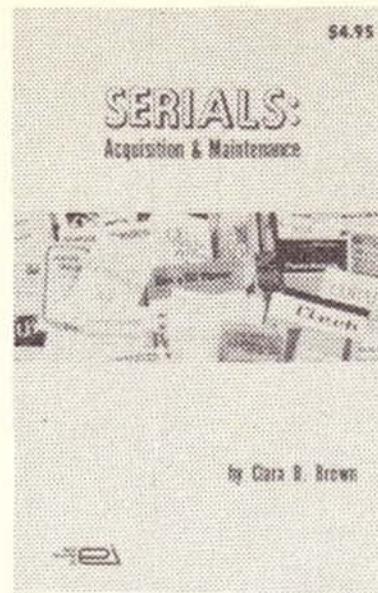

In September 1973, the School of Library Science of Simmons College, Boston, will inaugurate a new program leading to the Doctor of Arts degree. The doctoral program will specialize in public or academic library administration or school media center administration. Among other requirements for admission, candidates must present not only a graduate degree from a program accredited by the American Library Association but also a graduate degree in another discipline.

The Doctor of Arts, a new academic credential wholly distinct in character from either the Ph.D. or the D.L.S., is designed to meet the particular need of practicing administrators at the doctoral level. A distinguishing characteristic of the D.A. degree is the absence of any requirement for a dissertation. Insofar as is known, Simmons College is the first to offer the Doctor of Arts degree in library science, although it is currently available in various areas of the arts and sciences in other colleges and universities. 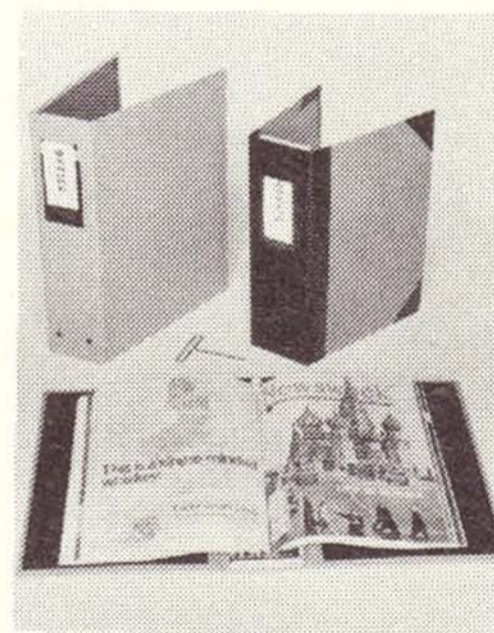
