• A Directory of Information Resources in the United States: Federal Government (1974) is the ninth in a series compiled by the National Referral Center, Library of Congress. The last of four currently scheduled revisions of earlier volumes in the series, this edition, produced with support from the National Science Foundation, updates a directory published in 1967 with the subtitle Federal Government, With a Supplement of Government-Sponsored Information Resources.

Unlike the other directories in the series, which are subject oriented, Federal Government covers all subjects. All federal organizations were eligible for inclusion, regardless of their areas of interest. Entries in the directory

are based on a register of information resources that has been continuously expanded and updated since the center was established in 1962. To ensure textual accuracy, each entry was submitted for review to the organization covered.

The supplement (bound with the present directory) differs significantly from the supplement to the 1967 Federal Government volume, as reflected in the different subtitles. The 1967 directory supplement listed any information resource sponsored in whole or in part by the federal government; the more limited supplement to this directory lists only those governmentsponsored organizations that are considered to be "information analysis centers," as defined by the former Panel on Information Analysis and Data Centers (Panel 6) of the Committee on Scientific and Technical Information (COSATI).
