ARL preservation briefing

The Association of Research Libraries (ARL) has published *Library Print Preservation: An Administrative Briefing.* Written by George Soete, with contributions by Janice Mohlhenrich Lathrop, this 29-page report offers a nontechnical review of preservation issues for administrators. It is intended to aid in understanding the issues, planning effectively, and communicating with preservation specialists. The report focuses on paper-based collections and explains both preventive strategies and major treatment options.

Household product safety

The National Library of Medicine (NLM) has mounted a Household Products Database on its Web site at householdproducts.nlm. nih.gov/index.htm. It contains information about the manufacturer, active ingredients, health effects, and handling and disposal of more than 4,000 brand name products. This information was gleaned from Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) supplied by the manufacturers. The database may be browsed alphabetically by brand name or by one of seven categories (auto products, home inside, pesticides, landscape/yard, personal care/use, home maintenance, and hobbies and crafts). Products are cross-linked to each other by similar usage, manufacturer and active ingredients, and the database is linked to NLM toxicology resources.

Exhibits workshop
