Deaths

A member of LACUNY's Executive Committee, Conahan served as vice president (1998–99) and was the incoming president.

Stanley D. Nash, head of reference and the Anglo-American History Selector at Rutgers

University's Archibald S. Alexander Library, died on September 7, 1999, after a long illness. Nash began his Rutgers' career in 1986, after previously working at William Paterson College and New York University. At Rutgers, he served for many years as instruction coordinator at Alexander

He was the principal creator of an award-winning Web page on British and American History.
