The International Association of Sound and Audiovisual Archives (IASA) published *Guidelines on Production and Preservation of Digital Audio Objects.* It was written by members of the IASA Technical Committee, edited by Kevin Bradley of the National Library of Australia, and endorsed by UNES-CO as a recommended practice document. The guidelines offer advice about formats and long-term sustainability, whether creating digital copies from analog originals or digital originals.
