Retirements

Tom Dillard, head of the University of Arkansas Libraries' special collections department since 2004, retired in January 2012. Dillard began working in the field of Arkansas history in 1977, when he was appointed the first historian on the staff of the Arkansas State Parks. In 1981 he became the director of the Department of Arkansas Heritage, a cabinet-level post under Governor Frank White and later Governor Bill Clinton. During his tenure there, he organized and chaired the commemoration of Arkansas's 150th birthday celebration and was selected as the "Humanist of the Year" by the Arkansas Endownent for the Humanities. In 1986 he was hired as the first archivist for the University of Central Arkansas (UCA), assigned the task of building a university archives from scratch. In 1997 Dillard left UCA to join the Central Arkansas Library System, with the goal of creating an archival program. There he created the Richard C. Butler Center for Arkansas Studies. As curator of the Butler Center, Dillard worked with a statewide team to create the Encyclopedia of Arkansas History & Culture. 🖊
