



Fig. 1. Unenhanced sagittal MRI with T1-weighted (Fig. 1a), T2-weighted (Fig. 1b) and T2-weighted (Fig. 1c) sequences.




Fig. 2. Unenhanced axial MRI images with T1-weighted (Fig. 2a) and T2-weighted (Fig. 2b) sequences.
